INTRODUCTION

The pharmaceutical industry suffered from the oversight of drug safety over the past few years. Although some well-prescribed drugs had been marketed for several years, they were withdrawn from the market due to a variety of serious, unexpected and/or adverse drug reactions found in patients.

In 2009, the Government set up the Review Committee on Regulation of Pharmaceutical Products to review the existing drug regulatory regime and to find out long-term measures to deal with the drug safety crisis, after a series of drug safety incidents found in Hong Kong¹. The Review Committee then made a total of 75 recommendations² to strengthen the pharmacovigilance and drug safety mechanisms in Hong Kong by using existing resources and soliciting new resources from the Government. One recommendation is to enhance the current GMP licensing standards in pharmaceutical production to more stringent Pharmaceutical Inspection Co-operation Scheme (PIC/S) standards. Besides, the Pharmacovigilance and Risk Management Division is also established under the auspices of the Drug office of the Department of Health.

In view of the Review Committee's recommendations and the raising of ADR reporting awareness, there is an urgent need to equip staff in the pharmaceutical industry with up-to-date knowledge on drug safety and pharmacovigilance in order to cope with the most stringent requirements and regulations which set by both local and international regulatory authorities.

COURSE AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The programme is intended to be a beginner to intermediate-level programme in the field of drug safety and pharmacovigilance for learners who are working in but not limited to the following sectors: pharmaceutical production, import/export of pharmaceuticals, retailing and wholesaling of pharmaceuticals, procurement and supply of pharmaceutical products, regulatory affairs, risk communication and education.

It is the first ever award-bearing pharmacovigilance programme to be offered by tertiary institution in Hong Kong.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction is English and supplemented with Cantonese where necessary.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants shall have attained:

- 1) an Ordinary Certificate in a related discipline; OR
- 2) HKDSE Level 2 or above in five subjects including English Language and one of the following science subjects: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Combined Science, or Integrated Science; OR
- 3) HKCEE Level 2 / Grade E or above in English Language and FOUR passes in other subjects including one of the following science subjects: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, or Science and Technology; OR
- 4) equivalent qualifications.

Applicants who hold other qualifications but are aged 21 or above and have relevant work experience will be considered on an individual basis.

AWARD OF CERTIFICATE

The Certificate in Drug Safety and Pharmacovigilance will be awarded to students who have:

- 1. passed the written examinations and coursework in both modules,
- 2. attended at least 70% of the meetings in both subjects.
